The overarching objective of the project is to reunite the children living on the rail platforms with their parents and families with emphasis on preventing the children, giving non formal training to most venerable children once they are resettled, to revert back to the streets. Particular emphasis also given to preventing of trafficking among children living on their own on the streets.

#### **20. BACKGROUND: BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF THE ORGANISATION:**

MAGADARSHI is a registered society, working for the most venerable children, exclusively working for street children and child labours. The genesis of the organization stems from its vision of helping and enabling those children who are rendered homeless and who live in the most difficult circumstances in their struggle for survival, by factors which are, most often, out of their control. The experience of Margadarshi that even when the children leave their homes, it is actually a complex set of underlying factors which are instrumental in their decision to abandon their homes for life on their own. Though only a few children are orphans neglected rag pickers and vulnerable, in the true sense of the word, all of them ultimately end up living the lives of orphans. Margadarshi started initially covering Gulbarga, Wadi (Karnataka). The need assessment started with informal visits to the railway platform, bus stand and market making contact with the children. Slowly a rapport with the children was established. The children were provided with shelter food and gradually recreational visits outside the rail way platforms such as picnics to near by places were organized and non formal education. These initial attempts helped the organization to create the climate necessary for the children to open up and divulge the details of their history in terms of where they were from and their reasons for leaving home.

## Background

Margarshi began 14<sup>th</sup> April 2002 its work with street children on railway platforms of Gulbarga (now renamed Kalaburagi). It has been involved in many projects (in collaboration with the state government, independently as well as with other networks) addressing the issues of street children and child labour. It has also been part of various studies involving this crucial issue. Mr. Anand Raj, the Project Leader, has been active in many networks and forums engaging with the state for the protection of the rights of children. He has also contributed significantly towards improving the quality of management of many state-run children's homes in the district in the capacity of Chairperson/Member of the District Child Welfare Committee of Gulbarga. In the CRY operational area, and CHILDLINE project Margarshi has brought significant improvement by ensuring access to sponsorship

programs under ICPS (Integrated Child Protection Scheme) to children of single parents/orphan; re-enrollment of dropouts and child labourers in schools and hostels; approve of a high school after three years of advocacy; improvement of infrastructure/ facilities in Anganwadi centres providing pre-school education and supplementary nutritional under ICDS (Integrated Child Development Scheme) and schools; formed School Development and Management Committees (SDMCs) in schools.

#### Problem Statement:

Margadarshi is working in Chittapur, Sedam, Chincholli, Aland and Gulbarga taluka of the Gulbarga (Kalaburagi) district. Kalaburagi is considered as one of the most backward districts in the state of Karnataka. About 28% of the population in the district belongs to the socio-economically marginalized dalit community. The child rights situation is also poor in all the seven Talukas. The state is closing down schools in the district for the rationalization of resources and utilization. Karnataka has the second highest child labourers in 10-14 year old age-group in India as per 2011 census. Children are compelled to work as bonded labourers in landlord's agricultural firms/ houses or looking after cattle when their parents are not able to repay the amount of loans taken from the landlord. Elder children have to support their family in this time of crisis situation. Children aged 12 to 18 years old are involved in domestic work, quarry, cotton picking, cattle grazing, and agriculture and facing different risks like accidents while carrying loads in quarry work; get affected with Asthma in cotton picking work etc. Besides, children are also working as a part of a gang to dig and load sand; in hotels / bars in different capacities; driving tractors for owners or for rent; begging; rag picking and other seasonal agricultural work. Girls are perceived better at seed crossing, pollination, cotton picking, and chile picking since a lot of them are short in height and do the work more effectively. There is an access gap of 47% in primary schools by standards set by the RCFCE Act (Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009). And, there are only 4 government high schools for Grades 9 and 10 in the project area. The infrastructure situation is poor in these schools. While 16 schools do not have toilets, some schools do not even have drinking water. Major reasons for drop out in the area are poverty, search for survival needs, lack of access to school, safety and security concerns of adolescent girls, migration of parents, low educational attainment of parents, single parents or orphans with no care takers, health crisis in families and other problems in the family. Thus, dropout is influenced by a complex maze of factors from school environment to socio-economic and socio-psychological factors.

Whether we accept it or not "Street children, Unaccompanied Children, Malnourished Children, Missing Children, and Working Children or Child labourers, Child marriage" are a reality and are happening only among weaker sections of our society since they are more vulnerable and easily prone to exploitation, harassment, abuse and diseases. They are seen as untouchables by the public, deprived of love, affection, care and are forced to live in un-hygienic living conditions. In addition, majority of these young children are at risk of addictions due to unavoidable and realistic reasons which they have undergone in their life such as broken families, ill-treatment by parents or family members, company of bad peers, influence of elder or senior street children, to pass time, to forget the past or sad part of their life and to live in a dream world than the existing world.. Margadarshi Society®, a non-profit organization is working for these marginalized and neglected children and registered under The Societies Act, came into existence in the year 2002. The society works for the children without any discrimination of caste, creed or

color and brings them to the mainstream of the society by providing them with education, and necessary support. The society has been working for the past 16 years in the district of Kalaburagi.

My child hood at Jawalgera 1980 I had admission St. Anthons' primary school, then 5<sup>th</sup> STD I Admission Govt. higher primary school. I used to help the parish priest in church activities and in the garden after 7<sup>th</sup> std Then I wanted to be catechist so I join Christashrama Sindhanur I have studied 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> Govt. Junior college Sindhanur, by the time the catechist were sufficient so that they stopped then I went for Hospet for vocational training in Welding, I learnt the Tamil language too. after one year training I came back and searched for Job in Sindhnur finally I got the Job payment was Rs. 5 each day, then I thought only Rs. 5 I am getting I cannot earn more money let I go to the collage. I wanted to study TCH I went to the TCH collage the principal was my higher primary school head master (Mr. Shamboji he is Lingayath) I was happy and thought I can get the seat easily. But the head master ne did not give me the information but Brahmin girl got admit ion then I admission Govt. Junior collage for PUC.

Most of the relatives working in the DSS so I joined with them I use to go with them organize programmes with that spirit in Jawalger we created the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar youth sanga I was Treasurer.

Then, mean while I use to go to Welding work after collage earn some money for collage fee, Bus pass. And getting the cloths. During the PUC I st year summer holiday I Joint Tayera re buttoning company. After holiday again went to the collage however I have completed the PUC II year. I asked the Fr. Thomas That I wanted to Join the seminary he gave letter in my family no body was interested to send to the Seminary, I have collected the some money I took and went, their I got high fever then came back.

Then I have continued the Education BA admission in Sindhanur. After BA I went to Mysore MA and completed. Mean while I use to go to meet my brother in Hospet, by the time Rev. Fr. George kollashany was the director of the institute. He called me to Hospet some month to teach 10<sup>th</sup> std open school children and looking of the hostel street and drop out children. Then I joined the Don Bosco Seminary Mysore. I got injured then I came to Hospet took rest and returned to Jawalger.

One of my class met by name Pamesh Kattimani was completed the MSW and working in PRERAN Raichur he introduced the Mr. Pramod Kulkarey secretary of Prerana and Sathi Raichur. He gave job for survey of street children. After completing the serve he gave another job appointed as field officer of Child labour School. Then he shifted to the street children project field officer. I have learnt lot of information. With help Rev.Fr. George kollashany. He gave opportunity, so that I came out Sathi and started working in Gulbarga in 2002.

I have started with help of Rev. Fr. George Kolashny. Under guidance of Rev. Fr. Y. S. Peter, I have started in street children work in Gulbarga railway station Wadi and Solapur and I got fellowship in Action Aid India Bangalore.

Studies have shown that a majority of the children who leave home seek refuge on the railway platforms. In Hyderabad Region Karnataka State alone, it is estimated that around 40 children leave home very day. A majority of the children, who leave home, seek refuge on the railway platforms. The socio-economic background of the children has been found to be varied as, although the majority are from highly impoverished and poverty stricken families. There are also some children who are from relatively well to do families. The reasons attributable to the children striking out on their own are manifold, the more significant
