Objective: Girls complete secondary education & gain skills to negotiate key life decisions


VISION



Many Strands are Woven into Skilled Reading




Figure 1.9 Reading Rope




Critical milestone of language learning happens in the first few years of primary school






Reading voluntarily and frequently, inside and outside schools.


As children **decode**, they need to understand and **comprehend what is being read** – for which vocabulary and background knowledge is essential

IMPACT OF LITERATURE ON LITERACY

An *independent reader* is a product of robust, paced out **reading instruction** and **exposure to a variety of texts**

- A child ought to be reading at her decoding level and parallelly exposed to text **beyond her decoding level**
- Authentic Literature and **enhanced orality around it**, strengthens comprehension and fluency, specifically in Akshara languages
- Interaction with books also **builds vocabulary** and acquire complex language.
- A library creates the larger emotional and cognitive landscape for literacy, by establishing **meaning** as the main propeller - a critical outcome for effective reading


How Reading habit contributes to development of Foundational literacy skills



JSW Room to Read project – Hub and Spoke model



- **Cluster Libraries will be set-up and provided ~1500 books** over the period of 3 years
- **Innovative & Dedicated Reading space** will be created in all the spoke schools. Books will be received through monthly rotation process. Provision for Library bags for schools for the purpose of exchanging books
- CRP to play a key role in this rotation
- Teachers will be **trained on conducting 4 scientifically designed reading activities** including before, during & after reading activity
- **Books will be issued to children** for promoting reading at home
- This would allow an efficient utilization of library books



Read Aloud

- Helps children to listen to and comprehend a book, as well as to expose them to a variety of genres and texts.



Shared Reading

- Helps children to actively participate in reading the book, as well as enjoy the illustrations and words of the story.



Paired Reading

- It helps children to support each other in reading new or unfamiliar words. Children can be at the same reading level, or a more advanced reader can be paired with a less advanced reader who needs guidance and encouragement.



Independent Reading

- The objectives of this reading activity are for children to be able to read books at their comfort level, and to make independent choices about what they read.






LOCAL LANGUAGE PUBLISHING (LLP) TITLES IN KANNADA

- These are child-friendly, age appropriate, and content-rich books story books for primary grade children
- Presently, RtR has **142 titles** in Kannada (**10 in progress**)
- **30 titles** can be published by GoK




READING CARDS IN KANNADA

- 4-pager cards that have illustrated picture stories with minimum text (not more than 1-2 sentences per page) and more focus on self-explanatory illustrations
- Presently, RtR has **50 reading cards** in Kannada

TV EPISODES


- *Audio-visual representation of select RtR stories primarily produced for broadcasting on television during pandemic induced school closure*
- *Story is explained by a narrator with interactive texts and animations*
- *Each episodes is approx 25 mins*
- *Presently, RtR has 16 TV Episodes in Kannada*
- *Materials are available in the google drive and DIKSHA*

READ ALOUD VIDEOS

- *Read Aloud Videos (RAV) is created from select RtR stories.*
- *In the videos, the story is narrated along with the screen display of the storybook, pictures and text*
- *The videos are 4 mins to 10 mins duration*
- *Presently, RtR has 34 read aloud videos in Kannada*

LITERACY RADIO EPISODES

- *Radio Episodes are approx. 15 minutes long interactive audio stories in Kannada led by a narrator with 2-3 children in engaging conversation style storytelling*
- *Stories for the radio episodes were picked from selected RtR's children's storybooks*
- *The content was created for broadcasting on radio to benefit the children during pandemic induced school closure, specially for those who don't have access to any kind of phones – smart/internet based or key-pad*
- *Presently, RtR has 36 Literacy Radio Episodes in Kannada*

SHORT AUDIO STORIES (IVR)

- *These are 2-4-minute-long narrations of short stories from selected RtR's Reading Cards by a narrator with voice modulation*
- *24 Audio stories were created in 2021 to be broadcasted through IVR to help children engage in active listening, especially those with limited access to smartphones or internet-based devices*
- *Presently, RtR has 24 audio stories in Kannada*

AUDIO GAMES

- Set of interactive games recorded in audio and can be facilitated by parents/elder siblings for engagement with the children and get involve in their learning journey
- The audio games were created in 2020
- Presently, RtR has **40 audio games** in Kannada

Awareness videos on promotion of Home as a Learning Space

- Videos of 3-4 mins duration to promote parental engagement towards the development of skills such observational, deeper thinking, oral language development, and articulation among their children.
- Presently, RtR has **2 videos** in Kannada



FLIP BOOKS

- A booklet with a series of images and texts on a story. Readers can turn pages according to their reading pace and comfort level
- These flipbooks can only be accessed with use of internet in designated links and not available in drives, DIKSHA or youtube
- Presently, RtR has **27 flipbooks** in Kannada

LITERACY CLOUD

- Literacy Cloud is RtR's online platform of digital resources which contains materials of various languages spoken in India and globally.
- The books can be saved offline in the platform and read without the usage of internet. However, the books are not shared in drives, DIKSHA or any other platform
- While most of the materials can be accessed without creating a login, some resources can be accessed and downloaded after log-in
- Presently, **52 RtR story books in Kannada** can be accessed in the platform*
